ITEM 5:7-11 CONTRACT AWARDS AND AGREEMENTS

A. South Commerce Pathway Ramps

Jason Mayer, Giffels Webster, said three (3) bids were submitted ranging from \$45,782.00 to \$55, 816.00. He recommends the construction project be awarded to the low bidder, Best Asphalt, in the amount of \$45,782.00. Project cost will not exceed \$59,000 without prior authorization from the Township Board.

ITEM 5:7-11 CONTRACT AWARDS AND AGREEMENTS (A. South Commerce Pathway Ramps continued)

A. Sixth Amendment to the Commerce Towne Place Condominium Master Deed

David Campbell, Planning Director, said the intent of the Amendment is to split Unit 11 into two new condominium units, such that the three Barrington buildings will be within their own new unit (Unit 15) with the pond, wing wall, and commercial pad upon their own new unit (Unit 16). The Planning Commission recommends approval.

Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, said the title company handling the Township's property sales has indicated its desire for a record of Supervisor Gray's authority to sign purchase agreements and closing documents relating to the Township's sale of its properties.

- Petitioner accepted our mandatory insurance rider.
- 2) They want a 10-year contract as an exclusive provider at the rates they set and if breached by the Township, then the Township will pay for all costs incurred by them plus 50% of loss profits.
- 3) They rejected removal of the arbitration clause.
- 4) They will not change the repair time of the charging stations from 30 days to 15 days because there is no guarantee of supply issues.

MOTION by Sovel, supported by Berkheiser, to deny Proposed Electric Vehicle Charging Station Agreement – Charge EV, LLC.

Discussion took place. If approved, where will the pathway continue to? Emily England, Senior/Parks and Recreation Director will provide the Board, at the next Township Board meeting, with documentation from the Pathway Master Plan and where the pathway will connect to.

D. FY 2023 Community Project Funding – Library

Alyson Lobert, Library Director, advised the Board that the Community Project Funding has been approved for the library's self-service library kiosk. She will finalize the locations of the kiosks and ordering the units provided the Township is still interested in continuing with this federal grant project.

MOTION by Magner, supported by Sovel, to move forward with the Novel Branch library kiosks (up to five kiosks) Community Project in the Township.
