**b. Adult Service Programs** summary for October/November 2019. Marika Zemke, Adult Services Manager, has indicated that one of her goals for the upcoming year is to have each of the Adult Services Librarians develop one special program each month. She has four librarians and each one will have their responsibility of setting up one program per month.

The second Adult Winter Reading Program will be kicking off in January 2020.

c. Youth Services Programs summary for October/November 2019
Youth Services recently started a new collection of Playaway Launchpads, which are tablets pre-loaded with educational games and videos and specifically designed for library use (i.e., durable). Each individual Launchpad features its own theme. They have already proved to be very popular with our patrons.

Attendance for both adult and youth programs has increased substantially this year over previous years thanks to increased funding and staff hours devoted to developing new programs.

### d. Interim Director's Report

The Adult Services Department is planning to do outreach at various venues, including senior centers, professional offices, and coffee shops, by dropping off pre-publication copies of popular books stamped with the library's name, address, and logo.

As we learned at the last meeting, the township will soon begin accepting credit and debit cards. A training session for staff has been scheduled for December 16, 2019.

#### Memo from Trista Reno, Head of Youth and Teen Services:

In the month of November, the Youth department purchased 25 Launchpads for circulation. Launchpads are a library-friendly tablet that offers educational games for all ages and are specifically created for circulation in a public library by offering the durability and content we look for when purchasing materials. As of December 3rd, 11 of the 25 Launchpads have been added to the collection, much to the pleasure of our patrons. Of the 11 Launchpads in circulation, it took less than a week for eight of them to be checked out. We are extremely happy with the reception they have received and look forward to purchasing more in the next fiscal year.

Attendance statistics are also up from last year. I have included the numbers for the month of November in 2018 and 2019 below:

- · 2018 Storytimes: 9 storytimes with 235 attendants
- 2019 Storytimes: 17 storytimes with 481 attendants
- · 2018 Youth Programs: 8 youth programs with 191 attendants
- · 2019 Youth Programs: 9 youth programs with 202 attendants
- · 2018 Teen Programs: 5 teen programs with 13 attendants

- He noticed information about Commerce Township was outdated on the government channel that is on the Comcast Cable Channel Lineup. He requested all department heads provide an updated set of slides so they can be forwarded to Comcast Cable.
- Flyers will be mailed to residents regarding waste removal. The new waste containers from GFL Environmental Inc. should be delivered sometime this week and next week. GFL Environmental Inc. will being servicing Commerce Township the beginning of next year.
- Another tenant at 8585 PGR Drive will be moving out on Monday. We are getting closer to redesigning the building.
- M5 Bridge someone stole 3 parking lot lights with an estimated value of \$575 each. The grand opening of the M5 Bridge is tentatively set for April 18, 2020
- Barriers were installed at the pedestrian bridge south of S. Commerce Road. The barriers will prevent snowmobiles, ATV's, etc. from accessing the bridge. All bridges in the Township will eventually have barriers.
