ITEM 3: PUBLIC COMMENTS

Tim Sawmiller, 3090 Belle Terre, Commerce Township, MI quoted the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution protects the freedom of speech, religion and the press. He said this includes an individual's right to receive information on a wide range of topics from a variety of viewpoints. Public funded libraries play an important role in facilitating free and open acts information.

Colleen Crowley, 2405 Verna Lane, Commerce Township, MI, does not think any book should be suppressed or banned from a public library. She supports the First Amendment rights.

Violet Anderson, 17305 Hickory Wood, White Lake, MI, said she spent 5 years in the military and supports the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution and her right to read any book she chooses.

Becky Spagnuolo, 3066 Bennington Dr, Wixom, MI, supports the library's right to freedom of speech. She asked the library to not ban books. It should be the parent's responsibility, not the library, to decide what their children should read.

There was another patron of the library present that is in support of not banning books.

ITEM 4: CORRESPONDENCE

Correspondence was received from Angel Lyman thanking Bill Wines for hiring her as a Library Page 10 years ago when she was a high school student. She now has her dream job and credits Mr. Wines for his support and direction.

A memo was received from Tina Entwistle thanking Lauren Aquilina for a great job she is doing with 2-3 year old story times program at the library.

ITEM 5: FINANCIAL REPORT

Library Director Lobert reviewed the Revenue and Expenditure Report for the period ending August 31, 2022, (54.87% of the budget was spent so far this year).

ITEM 6: ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

a. Director's Report

Library Director Lobert -

September brings with it the start of the Library's fall programming season. The slate of fall programming at the library includes a genealogy series for beginners, American Sign Language for kids, robotics and a Shakespeare lecture. These programs are held in addition to regular weekly and monthly programs such as Chess Club, storytimes, yoga, makerspace and book discussion groups.

CTCL's librarians are hosting a winter reading program where, instead of earning prizes, the participants would be earning food for the hungry who live in our community. During a giving-focused time of year, we thought that our patrons would value the opportunity to make a difference in their community in addition to reading a lot of really great books. Track your hours read from Thanksgiving through January 1, 2023 and help earn food for our hungry neighbors through donations. For every 100 hours read collectively, the Friends of the Commerce Township Community Library, in partnership with generous individual donors, will donate a pound of food – up to 1,250 pounds of food. The Friends will donate a maximum of \$1,790 (1,000 lbs. of food) and I have another individual donor who pledged that they would kick in another \$447.50 (250 lbs. of food).

Imagination Library registrations continue to grow: 641 Commerce Township children under the age of five are currently enrolled in the program. 94 children have turned five and graduated from the program. We have officially exceeded the \$7,000 we budgeted

at the launch of the program; we projected 366 children would register for Imagination Library in 2022.

The Friends of the Commerce Township Community Library's next used book sale will take place in the Library's White Pine Room, October 5-9, 2022. Individuals interested in volunteering at the sale can register at tinyurl.com/FriendsFall2022

CTCL closed early – at 6:00 pm – on Monday, August 29, 2022 and remained closed through Tuesday, August 30, 2022 due to a power outage. The budgeted generator project continues to progress, slowly. The Library will soon undergo a load test to determine the proper sized generator to power the full building.

I am pleased to welcome Robyn Jenkins to the Commerce Township Community Library's staff. Robyn is CTCL's newest page. She comes to us from the Bloomfield Township Public Library.

Carolyn Christenson, Library Page, has resigned. She is a Walled Lake Central High School student and needs the time to focus on her education and after school projects.

Supervisor Gray received a few complaints about the banned book displays. Library Director Lobert has not personally seen any texts or email messages regarding this. If a patron has a concern they can fill out a Request for Reconsideration form and submit it to the library. The majority of the negative comments received are coming because of the display in the children's room.

We will have an upcoming project called the Book Bike, which is a mobile library funded by a generous donor. The bike will have a wooden box on it that will hold books for residents to check out. Library staff will pedal the bike out into the community at various locations.

Chairperson Garbutt said she received a call from someone who wants to donate a Little Free Library that will go into Wise Woods on the north side of Wise Road.


