ITEM 7:2-9 OLD BUSINESS

A. Lystek Information

Jason Mayer, Giffels Webster Engineers, included in the Board's packet was additional information to address questions that came up at the January 2021 Township Board meeting. The project plan is the next step that needs to be completed in order to keep applying for the SRF loan, if this is going to be a 2022 project. The intent to apply was submitted by the deadline. Dawn Lund, Utility Financial Solutions, said the \$270,000 spent on this would not affect her rate recommendations.

Trustee Sovel asked Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, if he is comfortable with the outcome of the research that was done. Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, answered yes, there are Federal and State levels regulating permitting. The liability is equal to or less than what the Township is currently doing. The product that is going to come out of the Lystek system is cleaner and safer than what we are dumping in the landfill right now. There is a push from both the Federal and the State to recycle. The Township should not be held liable if they comply with the permitting requirements. Lystek will haul away and test the biosolids twice a year. Further discussion with the Township's insurance company would be appropriate to discuss any liability due to application of the fertilizer to farmland in the event of an offsite hazard.

Further discussion took place.

Because Lystek has only 2 clients in the United States, the Township is requesting Lystek's financial records for the past 5 years.

- On the contract calendar supplied by Ben Sebrowski, Director of Technology, it shows the Richardson Center liquor license and the parks grass cutting contracts are all due to expire in less than 60 days. Emily England, Parks and Recreation Director said grass cutting bids are due back by February 17, 2021 and she will contact Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, regarding the liquor license.
- Lower Straits Lake Weed Control will there be a meeting in the spring? Supervisor Gray proposed a meeting to take place on March 25, 2021. He is waiting for confirmation.
- Did the fencing for the Benstein Cemetery come in yet? Dave Campbell, Planning Director, said the fence came in today and will be stored at the sewer treatment plant garage until it can be installed.
- While viewing what is happening in other municipalities in the State and surrounding areas, he noticed our Township's fiscal policy is working well. The Townships and the Cities that are in trouble and are begging for more money from the State and/or the Federal government are those that do not manage their Townships within their property tax base. They not only utilize those funds but they also rely heavily on other State and/or Federal funds to fund personnel and everything else.

Trustee Magner –

- Because of the comment made under Public Comments regarding the danger of thin ice on the lakes, she questioned if we should post some type of warning signs at the lakes. What is the next step? Treasurer Phillips said Lake Sherwood publishes a map showing the areas where water does not freeze on the lake. Trustee Weber said maybe during the start of winter we could put some type of warning on the Township's website and mention "no ice is safe ice".
- Merge Live she is concerned with zoom bombing from callers during meetings.
 Per Dave Campbell, Planning Director, the moderator from Merge Live is the only person who can unmute a person giving them access to speak and the ability to mute or disconnect the caller.

Trustee Berkheiser –

• The snowplow contract expires in October 2021. This seems like a short window to receive bids back before the winter season. Can this be moved to an earlier month?
