Trustee Weber -

- Are we sending notices via certified mail to property owners that are encroaching on Township Property? Jay James, Building Official, answered yes.
- He would like to make sure we follow up on contracts that are expiring soon. Jay James, Building Official is monitoring the contract's expiration dates.
- Asked Trustee Berkheiser for an update on the contracts for the leagues and Byers Farm. Trustee Berkheiser said that Emily England, Parks and Recreation and Senior Director has that information. He will ask her to put that on her agenda.

Trustee Berkheiser –

- Asked if there is a summary report from the Ordinance Officers. Supervisor Gray will email the reports to him.
- What is the plan to winterize the bathroom at Dodge Park? Mark Schoder, Maintenance Director, said he will obtain bids to winterize the bathroom.
- Asked for an update on Barrington Place. David Campbell, Planning Director, said Barrington Phase 1 was envisioned to be commercial to complement the Five & Main development across the street. Five & Main is still to be determined what it's fate will be. The owners changed course and decided they wanted to use the land for residential buildings. Their site plan was approved by the Planning Commission.
- Should we discuss what options we have when dealing with businesses in the Township such as invoking fines or revoking a license? Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, said it depends on the type of permit or license issued to a business.

Treasurer Phillips -

• Jason Mayer, Giffels Webster Engineers, said in his report that Peninsular Park paving is pretty much complete and talked about some type of retention for future repairs, etc. Do we have to get approval from everyone that is in the SAD to hold on to the money? Mr. Mayer said he requested the Road Commission put

together an agreement at least one year ago and he still has not received anything from them. The Road Commission said it is being reviewed. He is waiting to receive it so he can have the Township Attorney review it. He needs to find out what the remaining balance is so he can place that money in escrow.

- When we did the Interlocal Intergovernmental Agreement with West Bloomfield, if there is money left over in the fund that West Bloomfield paid their part into, and we got the bonds for our part, does that money go back to West Bloomfield? Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, will look at the agreement and get back with her.
- She received an email from someone at alzheimersupport.com and they wanted
 to know if they could post a link on the Township's website to their website to
 help people find elder care and places for people to live, specifically those with
 Alzheimer. Clerk Creech said we do not put outside links on the Township's
 website.

Trustee Sovel -

- Asked for an update on Tri-Party Funds. Supervisor Gray said he has decided not to bring the road projects back to the Board. He would like to see our traffic lights turned into smart lights so they can communicate with each other and also add additional turn lights.
- Asked the Township Attorney what the difference is between Township
 businesses that are classified as spa/day spa vs massage therapist businesses.
 Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, said he doesn't know if there is any difference
 except you are supposed to be licensed as a massage therapist if you're going to
 practice massage therapy.

Clerk Creech -

- Please send her items you would like added to the agenda for the Quarterly Township Board Discussion Meeting on 10-26-2021.
- Another tree has fallen down on the north side of the Commerce Cemetery.

Supervisor Gray -

- There will be a meeting on October 20, 2021 with the Eternal Rock Church to discuss the old Township Hall.
- Budget Discussion Meeting will be on Tuesday October 19, 2021 at 6:00 p.m.
- Lower Straits Lake is keeping their SAD cost the same as previous years and to use leftover money for a weed harvesting trial. He received a contract from Oakland Harvesters for approximately \$500.
- He will obtain quotes for approximately 7,000 sq. ft. of carpet for the Township Hall and report his findings back to the Board.
- Another Township parcel was sold.
