The cost estimate from Giffels Webster for the pathway is \$37,201.15. The Parks and Recreation Committee recommends approval.

ITEM 5: CONTRACT AWARDS AND AGREEMENTS

A. 2021-2024 Oakland County Police and Fire Dispatch Agreement Supervisor Gray said Commerce Township will pay Oakland County \$9,184.77 per month for the months of April 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022, \$9,459.27 per month for the months of April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023 and \$9,742.01 per month for the months of April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024.

MOTION by Sovel, supported by Weber, to approve the 2021-2024 Fire Dispatch Service Agreement Between County of Oakland and The Charter Township of Commerce (April 1, 2021 – March 31, 2024) and authorize the appropriate signatures. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

B. Intergovernmental Water Service Agreement with the City of Novi Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, said this Agreement has been approved and executed by the City of Novi and provides the terms for allowing BCS Realty, LLC to tap into the Commerce water system to supply water to its property until such time as Novi can supply water to the property.

MOTION by Weber, supported by Phillips, to approve the Intergovernmental Water Service Agreement between the City of Novi, The Charter Township of Commerce, and BCS Realty, LLC; and to authorize the appropriate signatures.

C. Emergency Operations Support Plan

Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, said the Township's Emergency Operations Support Plan expired on March 31, 2021. A new plan is required to maintain the Township's eligibility for reimbursement in the event of a disaster. He recommends approval.

ITEM 6:4-13 PURCHASES

A. Upgraded Fence for Lake-Level Control Structure on Union Lake Road Supervisor Gray said The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) asked Commerce Township whether the standard chain link fence would be acceptable, or whether the Township would be agreeable to pay the upcharge for a decorative steel railing. Total cost of the fence will be \$15,000. RCOC will pay \$7,500 and Commerce Township will pay \$7,500.

ITEM 6:4-13 PURCHASES (A. Upgraded Fence for Lake-Level Control Structure on Union Lake Road continued)

MOTION by Sovel, supported by Creech, to approve a decorative steel railing for the new level control structure at a cost not to exceed \$7,500. Funds to come from the Building and Improvement Fund. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

ITEM 7:4-13 OLD BUSINESS

A. Lystek System Update

Jason Mayer, Giffels Webster, provided the Board with the company's financial stability information and discount pricing. If Lystek happens to go out of business, the equipment being installed is not proprietary and local contractors can service the equipment without Lystek's assistance. The management of distributing the fertilizer product would also have to be done by a third party (such as Synagro) if Lystek is not able to manage it in the future. Lystek will hold the 2020 pricing for Commerce Township but only for 60 days.

Dawn Lund, Utility Financial Solutions, LLC will present her calculated water rates at the May 2021 Township Board of Trustees Meeting.

Discussion ensued on the potential for the Township to submit applications for funding.
